



Crime Reporting



Citizens are a vital link between what is occurring in their neighborhoods and the Northville Township Police. When crime goes unreported, criminals are free to operate again and again.

All residents should make a concerted effort to be aware of what is occurring in their neighborhoods. That person taking a "shortcut" through your back yard might have burglarized your neighbor's home. Sales people peddling magazine subscriptions could really be looking for an easy house to burglarize. A car cruising down your street might be "casing" your neighborhood.

If you notice a person behaving suspiciously, never hesitate to call the police. Be observant of the following:

- A person you have never seen before.
- A person (young or old) selling candy, newspapers or soliciting for contributions at your door.
- A repair or delivery person at your door or that of your neighbor.
- A person entering or loitering around a vacant house or building, as well as at stores after hours.
- A person sitting in a parked vehicle in parking lots or on neighborhood streets.
- A person or vehicle following children.

If you are in doubt about a situation, report it immediately to the Northville Township Police Department. Any report can be made anonymously, although it is not encouraged. When you call, be as specific as possible. Please familiarize yourself with the Northville Township Police Department's Suspect and Car Description Guide to assist you in making a crime report.
