Rep. Dingell secured \$963,000 in federal funds for Northville Township to upgrade its emergency communications technology. The project is one of 14 community projects Dingell secured for her district as part of a FY 2024 government appropriation package

## Wayne County to Improve Intersection of Six Mile and Sheldon roads

Wayne County will upgrade the Six Mile and Sheldon Road intersection in Northville Township starting July 8, 2024, with completion expected by December.

Improvements include new strain poles, upgraded signals, sidewalk enhancements, and better signage and markings. One lane in each direction will remain open, with reduced speed limits and load restrictions. Access to residences and businesses will be maintained. Flaggers will be present; please use caution in work zones.

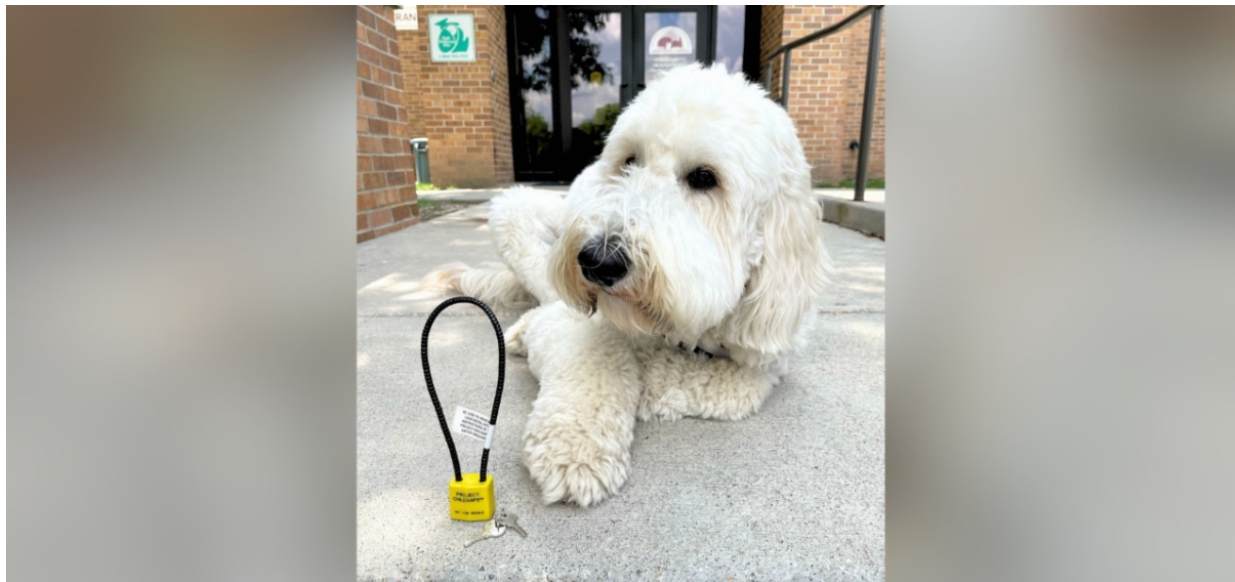
Director of Northville Parks & Recreation Derek O. Smith finds it fitting that the
